Sir,

In continuation to the Department's letter of even No. dated 12.10.2006 on the subject cited above, I am directed to say that after careful consideration of the recommendations and second visitation report of the C.C.I.M. and subsequent recommendations and visitation report of the Central Team visited your institution on 10.05.2007, in terms of the provisions of the IMCC Act, 1970 and relevant regulations of the CCIM, the Central Government has decided that the permission may be accorded to the Datta Meghe Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Nagpur to start their new constituent Ayurveda College at Sawangi, Wardha (Maharashtra) with the annual intake capacity of 50 seats in Ayurvedacharya (B.A.M.S.) Course from the session 2007-08 under the provisions of section 13A of the IMCC Act, 1970 subject to submission of two performance bank guarantees, one of Rs.1.50 crore for the Hospital and another of Rs.1.00 crore for the College, from a Scheduled Commercial Bank valid for a period of five years in favour of the Central Council of Indian Medicine, New Delhi and fulfilment of the following shortcomings/discrepancies revealed through the Visitation Report of the Central Team before making admissions of the first batch of students in their college:

- i. Labour Room and Operation Theatre be made fully functional.
 - ii. Separate hostels for boys and girls of Ayurveda College be constructed.
 - iii. Construction of Ground Floor be completed in order to run the College from their new building rather than Nursing College Building.
2. The compliance report along with the documentary proof regarding the fulfilment of the shortcomings indicated above should be sent to the Department and the CCIM as well.
3. The permission for the admission of the students in the above course will be valid till such time as the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination of the course and at that time, the College authorities may take up the matter for recognition of the qualifications under Section 14(2) of the IMCC Act, 1970.
4. The applicant university/college must ensure the joining of the teaching and non-teaching staff in enough number with requisite qualification as per the relevant CCIM Regulations well before the start of admission of the first batch of students in the 1st Professional of B.A.M.S. course, under intimation to the Central Government and CCIM.
5. The college administration has to develop the requisite infrastructure for IInd and IIIrd Professionals well in time as per the C.C.I.M. norms.
6. Please acknowledge the receipt of this letter.


